2. Answer the following questions in English in your answer book, starting a fresh page after the dictation. Full answers are required, but not necessarily in complete sentences.

Section 1

- (a) What was the reputation of the captain of the sailing ship Mary Celeste?
- (b) Apart from crew and officers, who else was on board when she sailed?
- (c) What did the master of another English ship notice about the Mary Celeste?
- (d) What did he do?

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Section 2

- (e) In what state was the boat?
- (f) What was in plentiful supply on board?
- (g) State two things which could be seen on the deck of the Mary Celeste.
- (h) What had the second mate been unable to finish?
- (i) What was found on the cabin table?

Section 3

- (i) Where was the lifeboat?
- (k) Two important things were missing. What were they?
- (1) What was odd about the log-book?

You now have two hours in which to answer questions 3, 4 and 5.

3. Translate into English:

Mon ami Templeton était un personnage bien singulier. Il avait environ cinquante ans, mais il était encore bel homme, très cultivé et toujours élégamment vêtu. S.A. 66/891 © 1968 University of London could buy. Naturally, I invited him at once. Templeton was, after all, an old friend and I felt I should do something for him.


